Cases involving dizziness and abdominal pain made up more than 50% of emergency medical calls, driving a slight rise in first-quarter ambulance dispatches to an average of roughly 130 per day, the Fire Services Bureau (CB) said yesterday. Ambulance calls in Macau reached 11,515 in the first quarter, up 106 calls, or 0.93%, from a year earlier, senior fire services officer Wong Si Tim told a press conference yesterday, adding that most cases involved dizziness, abdominal pain, fever, and various injuries. By order of the Chief Executive (CE), Sam Hou Fai, the rules and instructions for submitting 2027 budget proposals were published yesterday in the government’ s official gazette. Among the regular guidelines, CE Order No. 69/2026 states that when preparing budget proposals, the various services must note that no increases will be accepted over this year’ s budget. The CE noted the need for all services and departments to carefully assess the necessity and rationality of all expenses, ensuring that they do not exceed the budgeted expenses approved for the current year. In a written inquiry submitted to the Legislative Assembly, Lam noted a potential lack of communication among government departments, particularly regarding maintenance of the street drainage system, which often causes flooding even in non-extreme weather. - [Police crackdown on illegal currency exchange uncovers 32 cases](#) (2026-05-27 00:38)

The Unitary Police Service (SPU) has concluded a 13-day special operation targeting illegal currency exchange and other criminal activities, resulting in 32 cases of illicit money changing, authorities said. The operation, which ran from May 12 to 24, was conducted by the SPU together with the Public Security Police (PSP) and the Judiciary Police (PJ). Enforcement focused on casinos and surrounding areas known for illegal currency exchange, with intensified crackdowns on so-called “money changers.” During the 13-day period, authorities carried out 59 patrol and enforcement operations. The Judiciary Police (PJ) have issued a public alert urging residents to watch out for phishing text messages falsely claiming to be from the “Transport Bureau” regarding “traffic violation fines.” Authorities said scammers are sending messages stating that “unpaid fines will affect driver' s license renewal,” prompting recipients to click on a link. The link redirects users to a phishing website that mimics the official traffic violation fine inquiry interface, where victims

The interdepartmental fuel monitoring group urged residents and businesses not to stockpile LPG and called on the public to stagger refuelling and gas orders to avoid congestion at petrol stations and pressure on delivery services. - [Subsidies for LPG, gasoline roll out today](#) (2026-05-26 00:44)

Direct government subsidies for liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) and gasoline takes effect today, as authorities move to offset rising fuel costs affecting households and small businesses. Residents are eligible for direct government subsidies of MOP2.55 per kilogram for liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) and MOP1.5 per liter for gasoline. The two-month subsidy measure was announced Friday by the Economic and Technological Development Bureau (DSEDJ), with the LPG and gasoline subsidies taking effect today following the rollout of the diesel subsidy earlier this month. Air Macau is slated to resume flights between Macau and Manila on July 2, operating five times per week. - [Audit finds systemic lapses in oversight of continuing education enrollment quotas](#) (2026-05-26 00:40)

A follow-up review report released Friday by the Commission of Audit (CA) found that, under the Continuing Education Development Plan, the Education and Youth Development Bureau' s (DSEDJ) failure to perform consistent on-site inspections allowed enrollment quota violations to go undetected, with no corresponding investigations or penalties carried out. The audit commission report revealed that the Continuing Education Development Plan – already flagged for multiple past deficiencies – continued to experience anomalies during its fifth phase, including instances where numerous students enrolled in similar courses across institutions but recorded no attendance. The Public Security Police Force (PSP) received 5,237 cases of “lost property not reported” from 2023 to 2025, including 315 involving suspects, official data showed. Macau law classifies failure to report found property as a criminal offence, as authorities continue to record large volumes of lost-and-found cases each year. During the same period, more than 93,000 found-item reports were registered. Common items included identification documents, mobile phones, bank cards and Macau Pass cards. Police also handled a record case involving HKD1 million in cash. - [Private clinics account for over 76% of primary health care consultations in 2025](#) (2026-05-26 00:36)

Private clinics accounted for more than three million consultations last year, representing 76.3% of all consultations at primary health care establishments in 2025. According to a statistics release from the Statistics and Census Service (DSEC), the 767 primary health care establishments in Macau, including public health centers and private clinics, served some 3,940,000 people, with public facilities responsible for only 23.7% (932,000) of those. In total, private clinics handled 3,008,000 consultations of various kinds, accounting for more than two-thirds of the market’ s demand. The Consumer Price Index (CPI), the indicator of price inflation in Macau, recorded a 1.21% year-over-year increase in April and a 0.31% month-over-month increase, according to the Statistics and Census Service (DSEC). According to the official statistics, the Composite CPI also grew by 0.61% over the 12 months ending in April (May 2025 to April 2026), compared with the previous equivalent period. The DSEC noted that fuel price increases played a decisive role in the rise in the CPI, despite several categories of goods and services recording significant increases. Visitor arrivals increased by 11.3% year over year to 3,441,396 in April 2026, according to information from the Statistics and Census Service (DSEC). According to the DSEC, international visitor arrivals also surged during the same period, but by a smaller margin than the overall figure, rising 10.5%. In the same data release, the DSEC noted that the increase in visitor arrivals was almost entirely due to same-day visitors (2,095,953), which rose by 19.4%, while
